It runs Thursday through Sunday so you only have to take two precious vacation days to make it happen.
- * The camp is located near Paisley, Ontario on the Saugeen River and is called Hidden Valley Christian Camp. You can explore it on the web at www.hvccamp.ca. It is only 194 kilometers from Olivet and just 154 kilometers from Carmel. It is also only 189 miles from Oak Arbor, Michigan so we are warmly welcoming any of our southern neighbors from the United States to attend as well! Canoeing and fishing are available and the camp is just 20 kilometers from the beach on Lake Huron.
- * The General Church in Canada has been wonderfully supportive of this venture and, there are scholarships available to ensure that the camp is affordable enough for most everyone to attend!

- * The wonderful thing about this opportunity is that we will have exclusive rights to the place, so we can set meal times in the dining hall and program times in the meeting hall to suit our needs. We are fortunate to have found an available weekend like this during the summer months, so if the camp works out well then we can lock in a weekend and make it an annual tradition.
- * Cathy and I had a chance to check out the facilities and they should work really well. We were impressed with the beauty of the location, and there should be tons of fun stuff for families to do together. Below is a brief run down of the facilities.

Director’s Cabin – 2 bedrooms, bathroom, sitting room & kitchen
Infirmary – Queen bed & bathroom
Cook’s Cabin – 2 separate bedrooms with queen/single & double

Motel – 5 rooms with double or queen size beds
Camping – with tents or RVs, available with electricity
Women’s Bathroom – 4 sinks, 4 showers, 4 stalls
Men’s Bathroom – 4 sinks, 4 showers, 4 stalls
